About the Project



In the European Union, addressing climate change and promoting civic participation are fundamental priorities that go hand in hand. The EU recognizes that effectively tackling climate change requires the active engagement of citizens, local communities, civil society, and various stakeholders. The EU has established a comprehensive climate policy framework aimed at reducing greenhouse gas emissions, increasing energy efficiency, and transitioning to a sustainable and low-carbon economy. Key components include the European Green Deal, the Fitfor55 Package, and the EU Climate Law, which set ambitious goals to achieve climate neutrality by 2050. Civic participation is encouraged through public consultations and engagement with civil society organizations to shape and implement these policies. Within this framework, the project GREEN EU - Building European Resilience to Climate Change Impacts, funded by the EU's CERV program, is situated.

The project includes the following activities:

- Conducting a transnational survey involving at least 450 people from 18 EU countries to assess the level of awareness and understanding of climate change factors and challenges among the general public. The survey results will provide evidence-based insights that will enable the consortium to provide a set of bottom-up recommendations to support policy decisions.
- Organizing a series of transnational and national events focusing on various aspects
 of environmental and climate issues, such as the circular economy, biodiversity
 conservation, renewable energy, sustainable infrastructure, and adaptation
 measures, always relating them to the theme of civic engagement.



Local Public Transport in Rome

From Fiumicino Airport:

1. Leonardo Express Train:

- Duration: Approximately 30 minutes.
- Frequency: Departs every 15 minutes.
- Cost: €14 per person.
- Description: The Leonardo Express is a non-stop train service connecting Fiumicino Airport (Leonardo da Vinci Airport) to Roma Tiburtina station. Trains are modern, comfortable, and equipped with amenities like Wi-Fi.

2. Regional FL1 Train:

- Duration: Approximately 45 minutes.
- Frequency: Departs every 15 minutes.
- Cost: €8 per person.
- Description: The FL1 regional train connects Fiumicino Airport to various destinations in Rome, including Tiburtina station. While it makes several stops along the way, it's a more economical option compared to the Leonardo Express.

3. Terravision Bus:

- Duration: Approximately 45 minutes.
- Frequency: Departs every 30 minutes.
- Cost: €5-6 per person.

- Description: Terravision offers a convenient bus service from Fiumicino Airport to Roma Tiburtina. Buses are comfortable and equipped with luggage storage. Tickets can be purchased online or at the airport.

From Ciampino Airport:

1. Terravision Bus:

- Duration: Approximately 40 minutes.
- Frequency: Departs every 30 minutes.
- Cost: €5-6 per person.
- Description: Terravision provides a direct bus service from Ciampino Airport to Roma Tiburtina. The journey is comfortable, and buses are equipped with luggage storage. Tickets can be purchased online or at the airport.

2. Atral/Schiaffini Bus:


- Duration: Approximately 40 minutes.
- Frequency: Departs every 30-40 minutes.
- Cost: €3-5 per person.
- Description: Atral/Schiaffini offers bus services connecting Ciampino Airport to various locations in Rome, including Tiburtina station. It's a budget-friendly option for travelers.

3. Taxi or Private Transfer:

- Duration: Approximately 30-40 minutes (depending on traffic).
- Cost: Around €30-50 per ride.
- Description: Taxis and private transfer services are available at Ciampino Airport for direct transportation to Roma Tiburtina. While more expensive, they offer convenience and door-to-door service.

Note: It's advisable to check the latest schedules and ticket prices before traveling, as they may vary. Additionally, consider factors like traffic conditions and the time of day when planning your journey.
